

Historical Preservation Committee Guidelines:

The Historical Preservation Committee works to preserve the historical assets of the park and ensure that Park users are informed about the historical elements that make the park a unique Baltimore resource. The Historical Preservation Committee works in coordination with Baltimore County and at times with the Trails Committee. The Historical Preservation Committee meets once a month, usually on the second Thursday of the month, for informational and planning purposes.

The Historical Preservation Committee sponsors or co-sponsors various hands-on historical restoration projects and interpretive presentations in the park and volunteer outings to meet specific park needs.

The Historical Preservation Committee and other Lake Roland Nature Council volunteers have considerable knowledge of the historical sites in the park. Lake Roland Nature Council and Lake Roland staff have gathered a good collection of photographs, maps and other artifacts documenting the history of the park with the intent of further documentation and preservation.

In addition, the Historical Preservation Committee focuses on mutually beneficial strategic relationships with individuals and/or organization that may bring significant subject matter expertise and resource to the park to further historical restoration and preservation. At times these relationships rise to the level of Strategic Planning Initiatives.
